


Fourth All India Handloom Census, 2019-20

Size of the Sector

According to the Fourth All India Handloom Census, the total number of households in India engaged in handloom activities (weaving and allied activities) is 31.45 lakhs. This is an increase over the Third census where the count was 27.83 lakhs.

The principal reason behind this increase may be attributed to the success of various initiatives undertaken by the Government of India, as well as several levels of due diligence that have been built into the census design, involving various oversight measures by multiple stakeholders from the Government machinery.

Once an entire block was enumerated and the quality checking done, the data was provided to the respective district officers through an online validation portal for ratification as well as to add any missing weaver/allied workers



households/villages, which the agency had to cover through re-visits after assessing eligibility. At the end of this process, the entire survey data for each State was shared with respective State Handloom Departments to cross-check data points so that any correction can be carried out within the overall fieldwork period.

Weaver households

A total of 25,45,312 weaver households have been covered under the Fourth All India Handloom Census.

The total number of weavers enumerated in this round are 26,73,891. Four States of India account for 18 lakhs of all weaver households in the country. These States are Assam (10.9 lakhs) households, West Bengal (3.4 lakhs), Manipur (2.1 lakhs) and Tamil Nadu (1.7 lakhs).

22.5 lakhs (or 88.7%) weaver households are located in rural areas while 2.8 lakhs (or 11.3%) are in urban areas, with nearly 72% of handloom weavers being female. Across both urban and rural areas, the share of weavers aged 14 – 18 years is 2.4% only. Nearly one in four weavers have not received any formal education while a further 14% have not completed primary level.

Among the 26.73 lakh weavers enumerated, the average number of person days of engagement in weaving activity is 208 days in the past one year. Engagement opportunities are more for workers residing in urban areas (262 days) as against those in rural areas (201 days). In comparison, the average number of person days of engagement was 183 days during the Third Handloom The top five States with highest average number of person days of work are Maharashtra (310), Andhra Pradesh (302), Delhi (292), Chhattisgarh (290) and Puducherry (286).

Majority (66.3%) of the weaver households earn less than Rs.5,000/- per month. 36.1% of weaver households from urban India earn more than Rs.5,000 a month as compared to only 25.1% living in rural areas. According to the Third Handloom Census, it was estimated that 99% of all weaver households earned less than Rs.5,000 per month. This proportion has come down to 66.3% in the Fourth Handloom Census, while proportion earning between Rs.5000 to Rs.10,000 a month has gone up to 26.3%. There are 3 States where 60% or more of the weaver households have earned in excess of Rs.5000 per month. These are Goa (95.5%), Uttarakhand (69.8%), and Maharashtra (60.3%).

The increase in earnings may be attributed to the several initiatives taken up by Government of India for the welfare of the weaver community, including providing financial assistance under flagship schemes such as National Handloom Development Programme (NHDP), Comprehensive Handloom Cluster Development Scheme (CHCDS), Handloom Weavers Comprehensive Welfare Scheme (HWCWS) and Yarn Supply Scheme (YSS). In addition, setting up of CFCs at block/ municipality level, concessional credit under Weaver's MUDRA scheme and introduction of the India Handloom Brand to enhance market demand have also been impactful interventions in the sector by the Government.

However, a significant share of weaver households continue to earn less than Rs.5,000 a month and relatively low returns from the sector is perhaps the key determinant behind the fall in average number of weavers per household between the two censuses, from 1.28 in the Third census to 1.05 in the current census.

Overall engagement in weaving activities is of full time nature, more so among male workers (75.6%). However, the exception is that in rural areas, there are more women weavers engaged in this activity as a part time endeavour (63.5%).

82% of weavers in rural areas work independently, i.e. are self-employed, while in urban areas, this is nearly 51%. States where the weavers are more organised (working under a co-operative society, under KVIC/KVIB, or with SHDC), include Goa (95%), Kerala (71%), Puducherry (91%) and Tamil Nadu (56%).

The survey reveals that majority of the weaver household members are not aware of various schemes available to enable them in the weaver activities of handlooms. Response on lack of awareness on the existing schemes, trainings and other enablers is more than 65% and beyond.

Excluding Assam and Meghalaya (where issuing of Aadhar card started very late) the penetration of Aadhar card among weavers stands at 96.7%. This 96.7% has been calculated on a base of 14.75 lakhs weavers.

Out of the total of weavers who have been enumerated, 23.3% have a bank account. Banking penetration is higher among weavers living in urban areas (41.8%) than those living in rural areas (only 20.8%).

The survey data clearly indicates that at an aggregate level, insurance penetration (life or health) is very low among weaver households (3.8%). Though only 7%, the penetration of insurance among urban weavers is over double that of rural areas (3.3%). Overall awareness of Weavers Health Insurance Scheme (WHIS) among weavers themselves is extremely low (only 2.6%) and of those who are aware, only 1 in 3 have been covered by the scheme.

Allied Worker

An allied worker is someone who undertakes only pre-loom and/ or post-loom activities. Allied workers are found in both weaver households as well as in allied worker household. An allied household is one which does not have weavers or looms.

A total of 8,48,621 allied workers have been covered under the Fourth All India Handloom Census, out of which 6,37,870 allied workers are working in 5,99,527 allied households, and 210,751 allied workers are working in 1,72,911 weaver households.

Across both urban and rural areas, the share of allied workers aged 14 – 18 years from allied households is only 3.8% whereas share of allied workers aged 14 – 18 years in weaver households is 9.4%. Similar to the weavers, this perhaps indicates that moving forward, it will be a challenge to involve the next generation workers from such households to be actively involved in the pre-loom and post-loom activities.

Higher number of females are involved in allied activities related to the handlooms. In fact, female work force participation rate in allied activities in this sector is twice as much higher than their male counterpart. This trend is true



for both urban and rural areas. 27.1% of the females engaged as allied workers in this sector have either not received any formal education or have not completed primary level; for male workers, this number is slightly lower, at 20.5%.

The average number of person days of engagement in allied activities by allied households (194) are much lower than their weaver household (238) counterparts. Engagement opportunities are more for workers residing in urban areas as against those in rural areas. The top three States for allied workers, from allied households, with maximum average man days of work are Chhattisgarh (334), Andhra Pradesh (261) and Odisha (261); while for those belonging to weaver households are Haryana (309), Andhra Pradesh (285). And Punjab (274).

Overall engagement in allied activities is of part time nature, more so among male workers. Most male workers from allied households in rural areas are engaged in this activity as a part time worker (54.6%) but the situation is reverse in urban areas where a higher proportion of male workers are engaged full time (62.2%). However, for female allied workers, full time engagement is predominant except among allied households situated in rural areas.

Distribution of allied workers by employer typology throws up stark differences between urban and rural areas. First of all, nearly 2 in 3 workers in rural areas work independently, i.e. are self-employed. In fact, in urban areas nearly half of the allied workers work with master weavers, while this is only 31.2% in rural areas. Very few allied workers are engaged with SHDC or KVIC, though around 10% in urban areas do work with/for cooperative societies engaged in handloom activities. Here there is no difference between allied workers belonging to allied or weaver households.

Non-households

The working definition of a non-household in this sector is a unit that is engaged in production related activities (weaving and allied work) using looms. Non-household units which are solely into sales/ marketing/ wholesale/ retail but not into production have not been included.

In the current census, a total of 5,457 non-household units have been covered. Just



over 2.65 lakhs handloom workers have been engaged in such units, out of which 65.9% were engaged in non-household units located in rural areas.

At an all India level, co-operative societies (70.3%) dominate in type of units; the dominant States being are Assam (31.3%), Tamil Nadu (14.7%), Nagaland (11.7%), Uttar Pradesh (7.9%) and Kerala (5.9%).

These 5,457 non-household units own 1,22,302 looms in all. However, not all the looms are owned by the unit/proprietor concerned. Premises of non-households are also used as production hubs where looms owned by weavers were placed for their work, specially in the co-operative societies.

3,281 of the non-household units (60.1%) have reported idle looms. At an aggregate level, lack of market demand (50%), non-availability of weavers (27%), and lack of capital/ funds (23%) are the major reasons for looms remaining idle.

Looms

Across India, 28.2 lakhs handlooms were reported in the Fourth All-India Handloom Census, out of which 25.2 lakhs were in rural areas and 2.9 were located in urban areas. Handlooms are mostly locted in handloom weaver households (95.6%) which clearly signify that weaving on handlooms is primarily a household based activity.

As far as distribution of looms by typology is concerned, in rural India 41.7% of the looms are pit looms, 31.8% are frame looms, 15.3 % are loin looms while 11.2% are of all other types taken together. In urban areas, 53.1% are pit looms and 30.2% are frame looms. Loin looms are not as popular in urban areas, with less than 6% penetration.

Weavers themselves primarily own pit looms (42.2%), followed by frame looms (31.5%). Non-households also have more pit looms (57%) than frame looms (32.5%). On the other hand, master weavers prefer frame looms (55%) over other types of looms. 67.3% of all pit looms are with Dobby/Jacquard. At the same time, only 32.6% of frame looms are with Dobby/Jacquard. As a category, weavers-household units has the highest proportion of idle looms (17.6%); followed by master weavers who have 5.3% idle looms. The primary reasons responsible for looms remaining idle are lack of capital/funds and inadequate market demand for handloom products.

Production

On a base of 31.44 lakhs weaver and allied households, the largest yarn type used by handloom weavers in India is Cotton 1 to 20, which is being used by 30.4% of weavers and allied workers enumerated. This is followed by Cotton (21-80) which is being used by 27.5% of

the handloom workers; and this is followed by Cotton (>80), which is being used by 9.3% of the workers

6.83 lakhs handloom worker households weave sarees, which is approximately 22.9% of all such households. The State of West Bengal dominates the saree production market but so does Tamil Nadu and Andhra Pradesh besides the North East (silk sarees from Assam and Tripura). Together these 5 States accounts for over 78.6% of the handloom saree production in the country.

7.97 lakhs handloom worker households weave products such as shawls, mekhla chadder, Loi, stole, scarf, and muffler, which is approximately 26.7% of all households. The single State of Assam accounts for the bulk of the production of such products (77.4%).

5.80 lakhs handloom worker households (or 19.5% of all such households) weave products such as angavastram, dhoti, sarong, and lungi. Four north eastern States, led by Assam's Angavastram (an integral element in the traditional worship at the Kamakhya temple, account for 80% of the production of these major fabrics. The only other State with a sizeable production is Tamil Nadu which is a major Angavastram producing State.



Products such as towel, napkin, duster, and gamcha are woven by 4.91 lakhs handloom worker households, which is approximately 16.5% of such households. Two States completely dominate the production of towels, cloth napkins and dusters, Assam and West Bengal. Together they account for 84.4% of the production in the country.


Durries, rugs, and mats are woven by 3.5% of handloom worker households, which is approximately 1.01 lakhs households. The production of rugs, mats and carpets is dominated by Uttar Pradesh but there are other major producing States spread across north and east India, from durries in Haryana, Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh to rugs and floor mats in Assam.

Dress material (salwar, kameez, etc.), suiting, shirting, long cloth are woven by 3.2% (or approximately 0.95 lakhs) handloom worker households. The production of dress materials is more widely spread than most other major fabrics, even though close to 54% of the production continues to come from the north eastern States. Chhattisgarh and Andhra Pradesh are also significant producers.

1.01 lakhs (or approximately 3.4%) of handloom worker households weave bedsheet, furnishing, and blankets. By virtue of having the largest number of looms and weavers, Assam again dominates as the largest handloom based home décor production. However, nearly 27% of the overall production also comes from the two south Indian States of Tamil Nadu and Karnataka. Uttar Pradesh is also a major producer in this segment.

All others products including surgical bandage are being produced by nearly 4.3% of handloom worker households, or around 1.27 lakhs households. 5 States totally account for 74.3% of all other handloom fabrics including bandages, with Assam and West Bengal alone accounting for nearly 46.8% of the country's production.

On a base of 31.44 lakhs handloom worker households, 'open market' is the dominant source for purchase of hank yarn (76.6%), for dyed yarn it is 'open market' at 58.1% and for dyes and chemicals it is 'open market' at 49.7%. Similarly, the local market (64.1%) is the dominant source of sales.

Chapter 1

Prologue

"Our problem being to form the future, we can only form it on the materials of the past; we must use our heredity, instead of denying it." - T.S. Eliot

1.1 Evolution of Handloom Sector in India

India has a rich tradition of handloom weaving since time immemorial with the earliest evidences going back to the Indus Valley civilisation.

Various written treatise pertaining to the Rigveda, Ramayana, Mahabharata, Thalia (by Greek historian Herodotus) and Kautilya have mentioned not only spinning and weaving but also the high quality of silk and cotton.

Export of handloom products, as early as the fifteenth century was reported, followed by Vasco da Gama's visit to India thereby opening of trade routes for Europe. Further, Jean-Baptiste Tavernier's memoirs from the seventeenth century mention Burhanpur in Madhya Pradesh as hub for international trade with exports to Egypt, Poland, Russia and the Gulf region. Further, it is said that by the end of the seventeenth century, 83% of The East

India's Company trade accounted for clothing exports. Summing up this robust trade, Daniel Defoe stated that "everything that used to be made of wool or silk, relating to either the dress of women or the furniture of houses, was supplied by the India trade".

With the advent of the Industrial Revolution, the British began executing a protectionist policy in order to restrict import of handwoven cloth from India (to Britain) while dumping their machine made clothes, in India, from Lancashire. Towards the end of the nineteenth century, the cotton textile sector suffered from a range of challenges from economic recessions to natural calamities. In fact, for the period ranging end of the nineteenth century and the first three decades of the twentieth century, there was an ongoing tussle between dumping of British mill products versus Indian hand woven textiles with the rising call of Swadeshi goods.

Despite such adversity, Indian artisans have stood the test of time and have kept this great craft alive. Over the centuries, handlooms have come to be associated with excellence in India's artistry in fabrics. Fabrics and designs were influenced by geographic, religious and social customs of a region. Different parts of India have produced distinct styles – muslin of Chanderi, Varanasi brocades, Rajasthan and Orissa have given tie and die products, Patola sarees from Patan, himroos of Hyderabad, phulkari and Khes from Punjab, Daccai and Jamdani from Bengal, traditional designs from Assam and Manipur like the Phenek and Tongam. Indian handloom designs and weaves have been famous world over and it is important to ensure sustenance of our cultural heritage.



1.2 Women's empowerment through financial independence

Indian handloom sector is ancient and has served the economy well in terms of employment. The sector is very important from the point of view of its size and employment potential. The relevance of the handloom sector in the agrarian economy is massive because of its linkages with crucial and sensitive sectors like agriculture. It uses agricultural products as raw materials and, therefore, provides an ever-ready market for agricultural produce. Therefore, in an economy where majority of people still rely on agrarian sector for their livelihood, the significance of handloom is well understood.

Secondly, it is a sector that directly addresses women's empowerment. As per the present census, the sector engages over 23 lakhs female weavers and allied workers. The handloom sector is largely household-based, carried out with labour contributed by the entire family. Therefore, the engagement of a large number of women (over 70% of all weavers and allied workers are female) in any capacity in this sector has ensured direct remunerations for them, thus empowering them through financial independence and improved self-worth both within and outside of their homes.

1.3 Key milestones for the sector

August 15, 1947 marked a turning point for the handloom weavers of India. Mahatma Gandhi's use of Charkha, the spinning wheel, as a symbol of national regeneration and the subsequent focus on the handloom weavers during the freedom movement was largely responsible for the breakthrough.

The dawn of Independence provided an opportunity to accord priority treatment to the handloom sector. At the time of Independence, there were about three million handlooms in India, largely of poor quality because of inferior raw material and ill-organised marketing infrastructure. The situation worsened in 1952 due to a slump in the textile market. The All-India Handloom Board was reconstituted seven years after its dissolution in 1945, to advise the Government and propose schemes for the development and survival of handlooms.

With a view to raising funds for the sector and organising weavers' cooperatives, Parliament had passed the Khadi and Other Handloom Industries Development Act in 1953. To facilitate marketing of fabrics made in the handloom cooperatives, a national level apex body called the All India Handloom Fabrics Marketing Cooperative Society was set up in 1955. The Weavers Service Centre and the Indian Institute of Handloom Technology were set up to provide infrastructure back up in the vital areas of applied research, service and training.

The Handloom and Handicrafts Export Corporation of India Ltd (HHEC) was set up in 1958 to promote export of handlooms. In 1976, the Government appointed a high powered study team and on its recommendations the Office of Development Commissioner for Handlooms was created at the Centre to ensure a scientific growth of the handloom sector. Since then the Office of the Development Commissioner for Handlooms has been implementing various developmental and welfare schemes for the benefit of the handloom weavers. To ensure a steady supply of raw materials such as yarn, dyes and chemicals to the handloom sector, the National Handloom Development Corporation (NHDC) was set up in 1983.

1.4 Major interventions by Government of India

Ministry of Textiles through the Office of the Development Commissioner for Handlooms is working for the sustainable development of the handloom sector by implementing various developmental, promotional, and welfare schemes. The principal objectives of these schemes is to promote production and marketing of high quality and high value handloom products and thereby increase the earnings of weavers and other workers associated with this sector. Skill up-gradation, infusion of new and contemporary designs, product diversification, technology upgrades, improved access to subsidised raw materials. access to low interest credit, common infrastructure development, brand building, marketing assistance including promotion of e-Commerce platforms and linking handloom with high-end fashion, are but some of the major interventions initiated by the present Government. The following sections provides a more in-depth look at some of the flagship initiatives that have created significant impact on the lives of those associated with the production of handloom cloth.

1.4.1 Block level cluster

The block level cluster scheme aims at integrated and holistic development of identified handloom pockets through various interventions like skill up-gradation, Hathkharga Samvardhan Sahayata (HSS), construction of individual work sheds, design and product development,

creation of Common Facility Centres, etc. with Gol assistance to the tune of Rs.2 crores per cluster. While funding for most components is 100%, there is additional funding to the tune of Rs.50 lakhs available for setting up one Dye House in a district to ensure availability of quality dyed yarn for weavers. The cluster projects are taken up upon recommendations from the State Government.

1.4.2 Skill up-gradation

Skill up-gradation training and exposure is given to weavers and allied workers for learning new weaving techniques, adaption of new technology, development of new designs and colours, learning about new types of ecofriendly dyes and dyeing practices, exposure to basic accounting and management practices, familiarisation with e-commerce, etc.

1.4.3 Hatkharga Samvardhan Sahayata (looms and accessories)

HSS aims to improve the fabric quality and improve productivity through adoption of upgraded looms/jacquard/dobby, etc. Under this scheme, 90% of the cost of looms and accessories is borne by Government of India but the implementation is done with the full involvement of respective State Governments.



The construction of individual work sheds envisages providing a working space for the entire weaver family close to their home. The unit cost for these sheds are Rs.1.2 lakhs and marginalised households and female weavers are eligible for 100% financial assistance.

1.4.5 Engagement of designers

There is a provision for engaging professional designers in the block level clusters and beyond to design new innovative designs and products. The scheme not only pays for their fees, but further outlay is available for providing additional remuneration to designers for establishing marketing linkages.

1.4.6 Yarn supply

Under this scheme, yarn is supplied at mill gate price to weavers to compensate them for the high cost of transportation from mill gate to their workplace. In addition, 10% price subsidy is provided on cotton, domestic silk, woollen and linen yarn in hank form so that handloom weavers can compete with powerlooms in pricing. To facilitate regular and timely supply of yarn, yarn depots have been opened in handloom concentrated areas. To reduce delivery period and also facilitate delivery of small orders, warehouses have been opened in all States having significant handloom presence.

1.4.7 MUDRA loan

Under this scheme, working capital and term loans at 6% interest rate is being provided through banks. To leverage these loans, margin money up to Rs.10,000 is also provided. The Ministry also bears the credit guarantee fee to be paid to the banks to encouraging lending. The Online Handloom Weavers MUDRA portal has been developed for Direct Benefit Transfer of margin money to weavers' accounts and interest subvention and credit guarantee fees to banks.

1.4.8 Learning opportunities

To empower weavers and to enable the youth from weaver families towards career progression, MoUs have been signed between Ministry of Textiles and National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) and Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU). Under this agreement, both NIOS and IGNOU have

designed distant education courses relevant for the handloom sector. The ministry provides 75% subsidy on the course fees for SC, ST, BPL and female weavers for handloom weaver families.

1.4.9 Bunkar Mitra helpline

"'Bunkar Mitra" helpline for handloom weavers has been set up with a toll free number of 1800 208 9988 to provide single point of contact to handloom weavers across the country for addressing their professional queries. The service is available in seven languages viz. Hindi, English, Tamil, Telegu, Kannada, Bengali, and Assamese. The services are available all seven days of the week.

1.4.10 Welfare measures

Under welfare measures, handloom weavers are covered under Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana (PMJJBY), Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana (PMSBY), and Mahatma Gandhi Bunker Bima Yojana (MGBBY) (for those in the age group of 51 – 59 years). Under these schemes, weavers are required to pay only Rs.80 to enrol in these schemes while the rest of the premium is borne by Government of India.

1.4.11 Certification

The Handloom mark was launched in the year 2006 to provide a distinct identity to handloom products. The India Handloom Brand (IHB) was launched in 2015 for branding high quality handloom products. IHB aims to provide a bridge between the weaver and the consumer, giving the former higher earnings and the later, an assurance of quality. All the products under the IHB are benchmarked for quality of the raw materials, the processing besides providing the origin from the handwoven sector. Various prominent brands like BIBA, Peter England and ONAYA have already launched exclusive range of handloom garments with IHB.

1.4.12 Marketing assistance

Expos and District level events are organised regularly to provide a marketing platform to the handloom weavers. Weavers are also facilitated to participate in various crafts melas held across the country. Marketing Incentive has also been provided to Handloom agencies. As a new initiative, 23 e-commerce companies have been engaged to promote e-marketing of handloom products.

1.4.13 Handloom awards

Ministry of Textiles has been annually conferring various awards like Sant Kabir Award, National Award and National Merit Certificates, towards excellence in weaving, design development, and marketing efforts.

In addition to the above, State Governments also have their own schemes where they have earmarked significant outlays from their State budget towards betterment of weaver households in their State. These are initiatives over and beyond the centrally sponsored schemes which they partner in beneficiary identification and implementation. Some of the States with prominent schemes of their own include West Bengal, Tamil Nadu, Telangana, Andhra Pradesh and Chhattisgarh.


1.5 The end use of this Census

The Ministry of Textiles is convinced that the Fourth All-India Handloom Census is be an end

in itself, rather, the data collected against every household associated with this sector will be used as a master, dynamic database that will be maintained in the ministry portal.

Given that the time between the Second census and the Fourth census has been 20 long years, the idea is to create a provision for a dynamic database that can be updated and modified on a continuing basis by Weaver's Service Centres.

The intention is to have all individual weaver related information at one place which is dynamic, updatable, modifiable, and current. Future surveys can then be done on a sample basis to elicit direct feedback on existing schemes and beta test new ideas and concepts that have potential to be converted into interventions. The need for conducting a nation-wide census to get a count of handloom workers and their operations details will not be necessary.

Chapter 2

Basic Concepts and Definitions Handloom Census 2019-20

2.1 Introduction

For readers and users of this data, it is important that they are familiar with all the concepts, definitions and terms used so that there is better appreciation of the reporting and the data representation. This understanding will help the readers to appreciate the rationale of the questionnaire design and the subsequent analysis and aim for meaningful comparisons with the Third census data.

The concepts and definitions adopted at the Fourth Handloom Census, 2019, are as given below:

2.2 Definitions

Rural - Urban Areas

The rural and urban areas of India have been taken from Census 2011. For subsequent changes made to State and district changes (within a State) from www.lgdirectory.gov.in and respective State Government websites. Further, the use of Rural and Urban area definitions as per Census 2011. The list of Census villages have been identified from Primary Census Abstracts (PCA). Census 2011 also provides the base for list of cities, municipalities, towns, cantonments, non- municipal urban areas which constitute the urban areas. Further, urban areas are clearly defined as the following:

Statutory Town: All places with a municipality, corporation, cantonment board or a notified town area committee

Census Town: A minimum population of 5,000; At least 75 per cent of the male main workers engaged in non-agricultural pursuits; and A

density of population of at least 400 per sq. km

Out Growth (OGs): Are areas that come up near a census town or statutory town outside its statutory limits but within the revenue limit of a village or villages contiguous to the town. Examples – University campuses, Railway campuses, Port areas. Basically they have all facilities of a city like pucca roads, electricity, proper drainage system, hospitals, banks, schools, post offices and educational institutions

Urban Agglomeration: Continuous urban spread constituting its town and its adjoining OGs, or 2 or more physically contiguous towns together, and any adjoining urban OG of such town

The starting point of the Fourth Census is the list of villages and other identified handloom clusters (rural and urban) as provided by the various district and State administration across all States and Union Territories. Also, during the census field operations, many more villages and clusters have been identified through the method of snowballing. Coverage included villages/urban blocks having at least 5 weaver households.

Structure of Dwelling Unit

Kuccha house: Is a house whose walls and roof made of non-pucca material (unburnt bricks, bamboo, mud, grass, leaves, reeds, thatch, etc)

Semi-pucca house: Is a house that has either the walls or the roof but not both, made of pucca materials

Pucca house: Is a house whose walls and roof are made of pucca materials such as cement, concrete, oven-burnt bricks, stone, iron, timber,

tiles, slate, plywood, and artificial wood of synthetic material

Household

A household is defined as a unit/ group of persons who normally live together and take their meals from a common kitchen. Eligibility to be recorded as a Household member at the time of survey:

- All persons normally living together are to be recorded as household members
- All persons normally living together but staying away from the household on a short term seasonal migration and expected to come back within 6 months from the date of enumeration are to be recorded as member of the household
- In case the household head is staying away from the household for more than 6 months in the last one year, his/her individual particulars is not be recorded with the family. However, it is important to note that household members currently employed in military/ paramilitary services has been recorded with their household
- Normally considered as household member (e.g. child or grandchild or husband/wife or brother/ sister or other relative of household head) who are otherwise normal members of the household but living in a hostel for less than six months in the last one year
- Exception would be where household members have to sleep somewhere else, at night, for security reasons (for example, with livestock, in shop or other places of business), but for all practical purposes live as part of the same unit and have meals together
- Head of the household: The head should ordinarily be resident in the household. In rare cases, the head can be non-resident (e.g., where the person identified as the household head migrates to work for more than 6 months. He/she works in the nearby city and visits home on weekends).
- Chief respondent: Has to be a person, along with identity proof, who is a resident at the time of the survey and can provide answers with reasonable accuracy. If any female member of a household decides to declare

herself as a separate household, she has been recorded as a separate household. Widowed, separated, second wives, single women are some examples of women who have declared themselves as a separate household

Household handloom unit

Household handloom units are defined as households where one or more members are engaged in handloom related activities (weaving, preparatory and post-loom activities) in the last one yearwith or without complete looms in their premises (within or outside the house). Even if handloom related activities are conducted at the place other than the household premise, it has been considered as household handloom unit.

Handloom Non-Household unit

Non-household handloom units includes all establishments that are owned by institutions or private owners-society, such as a master weaver, cooperative societies, handloom development corporation, and undertakes handloom work for commercial purposes. These units may or may not own looms. Looms or other inputs for production of handlooms can be placed in work sheds in the premises of non-household units, or they can be distributed in the houses of the hired/ member weavers. In some cases, a mixed arrangement can be followed, with some of the looms on the premises, and the rest distributed in the houses of the hired weavers. For the Fourth census, only those Non-household units who have engaged in handloom PRODUCTION related activities (weaving) during the last 12 months USING LOOMS have been considered. Units which are into solely sales/ marketing/ wholesale/ retail have not been included as non-households.

Cooperative societies: These societies in the handloom sector is twofold: apex society and primary society. The apex society is an umbrella body for primary societies. Hence, weavers are basically members of primary societies.

Producer company: Is a group of enterprises located within an identifiable area, producing same / similar product. A producer company is

a company incorporated under the Companies Act and carries out activities as mentioned under Section 581B.

Types of Handloom households

Weaver household: Such a unit is defined as one that has any member of the household who operates a loom in the last one year, either within the premises of the house (classifying the household as a 'with loom household') or outside the household premises (classifying the household as 'without loom household'). A weaver household may or may not have handloom related allied workers:

- ► Household who own and operate looms in their household premises
- ► Households who own and operate looms at a place other than their household premises
- ▶ Households who don't own looms but engage in weaving activities and have looms placed in their household premises
- Households who don't own looms but engage in weaving activities (outside premises) and who are without any loom in the house premises

Allied worker household: Such a Household that has no weavers or looms, but members undertaking pre-loom and/or post-loom work in last one year either within the premises of the house or outside the household premises. These households need not have any members engaged in weaving activity within or outside the premises, nor do they have a loom within their premises. Such workers can also be engaged in allied activities within or even outside their household premises. For this census, the allied activities has been split into two major categories:

- Pre-loom activities like winding, warping, dyeing, tyeing and dyeing, sizing, loom setting and manual card punching
- ▶ Post loom activities like calendaring

Master weaver household: Usually, in the handloom sector a master weaver is construed as a non-household unit. But there is also a realisation that many weavers have grown to become a master weaver and are part of households that have other handloom workers

(weavers and allied workers). Hence, for the Fourth Census a concise definition was used to identity such households. Thus any household where more than 50% of the handloom workers are hired handloom workers, construe a master weaver household

Other household: Household with one or more members aged less than 18 years engaged in handloom activities but with no adult members (18 years and above) engaged in handloom activities

Handloom households by Loom Ownership

With loom household: These are households that have looms in their premises (which maybe or may not be owned by the household) with or without any member of the household engaged in handloom related activities

Idle loom household: These are households that have looms in their premises but have not been operated for the last 12 months (from the date of survey) but where household members are involved in weaving and allied activities

Without loom household: These are households that do not have any loom within the household premises. These can either be hired weaver households or allied worker households

Type of handloom by usage

For this census, only when the weaver claimed to use loin looms was the type of activity status enquired.

Domestic: Handloom work that is undertaken for non-commercial purposes and is used for self-consumption or used for the household

Commercial: Handloom work (weaving and allied activity) that is undertaken as an occupation and is used as a source of income. The product or fabric is sold for market consumption

Type of usage was captured only for working loin looms

Workforce

Adult and young workforce

Adult handloom worker: All handloom workers (weavers and allied activities) who have attained the age of 18 years

Handloom workers within the age group of 14 to 18 years: All young persons within the age group of 14 to 18 years involved in handloom related activities. All their details including bank details and photographs have been taken so that photo identity cards can be issued. The rationale being a census activity is carried out once in 10 years and excluding these young workers can deprive them of various schemes and direct benefit transfers (DBT)

Full-/Part-time handloom workers:

Full time handloom workers: Workers who operate looms, indulge in weaving and in allied activities, as defined for the purposes of this census, on a full time basis or exclusively for handlooms

Part-time handloom workers: Workers who operate looms, indulge in weaving and in allied activities, as defined for the purposes of this census but also undertake/ participate in other occupations to earn their living

Independent workers/ hired workers:

Independent workers: A person who engages in handloom work, be it full-time or part-time, who purchases raw materials from the market, makes cloth or performs allied activity product/service and sells in the market on her/ his own to earn a living. Since such workers operate on their own, they have been exposed to all types of business/ market risks

Hired workers: A person who engages in handloom work, be it full-time or part-time, in return for wages. They can work for institutional structure like a cooperative society, Khadi and Village Industries Commission, State Handloom Development Corporation, etc. or for private entrepreneurs like weavers, master weavers or traders

Level of Education

Never attended school: Such a person has never attended any formal schooling in her/ his life ever but can be literate or illiterate

Below primary school level: Such a person has attended school but not passed 5th standard

Primary school level: Such a person has passed 5th standard

Middle school level: Such a person has passed 8th standard but NOT 10th standard

High/secondary school level: Such a person has Passed 10th standard but NOT 12th standard/intermediary

Higher secondary school level: Such a person has Passed 12th standard but NOT completed graduation

Graduate and above: Such a person has completed her/ his graduation. It can be a baccalaureate degree in any field and could have even done a master's course (in any field)

Others: Such a person has a non-technical/ technical diploma or certificate not equivalent to degree

Type of Dye

Azo free: Azo compounds are found extensively in textile dyes which are considered to be toxic to environment. Dyes made without using azo compounds are called "Azo free' dyes. Reactive dyes and most vat dyes are azo free dyes, and are environment friendly

Natural: Dyes extracted from natural materials like vegetables, minerals, etc.

Type of looms

Working looms: Is a loom that has been operated during the last one year

Idle looms: Is a loom that has NOT been operated during the last one year

Pit looms with dobby/ jacquard: Is a fly shuttle pit looms which is fitted with a Dobby/ Jacquard. A dobby/ jacquard is used to enhance productivity. Dobby is a device that control warp threads. Jacquard which operates through a series of punching cards

Other Pit looms: Is a loom in which a pit is dug and the loom is placed within that. The weavers sit in the pit and uses pedals to control the weaving motion. Sometimes pit looms can also be slightly above the ground. There can be two different types of pit looms. One is where the weft yarn is thrown manually by the weaver; the other being where the shuttle, with the movement of slay, automatically flies from one side to the other

Frame looms with dobby/ jacquard: Is a frame loom which is fitted with a Dobby/Jacquard which usually aids in adding embroidery to the fabric

Other Frame looms: Is a versatile loom fitted with a frame (made out of wood sticks and boards). These can be moved since they are placed above the ground and where the weaver sits on a bench. This time pedal looms were also included under frame looms

Pedal looms are those where the shedding motion is done with a pedal. These are generally metallic frame and used to weave simple fabrics like dhotis, etc

Loin looms: Such type of looms are predominantly found in the North East India. This is a backstrap or body tension loom. The weaver's body is integral to the loom and weaving is done without mechanical parts. One end of the warp is held by a strap worn around the weaver's lower back to regulate the tension. These looms do not have permanent fixtures nor heavy frames & are easily portable. There is no pedal for the shedding motion, and every weaving motion is done by hand

Other looms: These looms, which may not conform, to the above types and can be specifically found in different parts of the

country like Inchakaranji looms, Chittaranjan looms, and Malabar looms

2.3 Definitions for Calculations


Number of days work per household for all handloom worker: Here, the total days of work quoted by all handloom workers in a household has been counted

Average number of days work per handloom worker: Here, the total days of work quoted by all handloom workers in a household has been divided by total handloom workers in that household

Average number of days of work per handloom weaver: Here, the total days of work quoted by all handloom weavers in a household has been divided by total handloom weavers in that household

Average number of days of work per handloom allied worker: Here, the total days of work quoted by all handloom allied workers in a household has been divided by total t handloom allied workers in that household

Work participation rate of handloom workers: Here, the total number of handloom workers (full time and part time) has been divided by total population of handloom worker households and expressed as a percentage.


Chapter 3

Weaver Households

3.1 Introduction

The art of weaving is an age old tradition in India that has been practised over centuries. Handloom weaving constitutes one of the richest and most vibrant aspects of Indian cultural heritage. Handloom is known for flexibility, versatility and innovativeness. The level of artistry and intricacy achieved in the handloom fabric is unparalleled and certain weaves/ designs are well beyond the scope of modern machines.

As per the working definition, a weaver household should definitely have at least one weaver, but may or may not have any allied workers. In fact, many weaver households do not have allied workers because these weavers themselves are also adept at allied activities. For the purposes of this census, allied activities have been defined as pre-loom (winding, warping, dyeing, tying and dyeing, sizing, loom setting and manual card punching) and post loom (calendaring).



According to the Fourth All-India Handloom Census, the total number of handloom worker households in India is 31.44 lakhs. This is an increase over the Third Census where the count was 27.83 lakhs. The number of weaver households which stood at 22.68 lakhs during the Third Census has also increased to 25.45 lakhs households in the current census.

The principal reason behind this increase may be attributed to the success of various initiatives undertaken by the Government of India, as well as several levels of due diligence that have been built into the census design, involving various oversight measures by multiple stakeholders from the Government machinery.

Once an entire block was enumerated and the quality checking done, the data was provided to the respective district officers through an online validation portal for ratification as well as to add any missing weaver/allied workers households/villages, which the agency had to cover through re-visits after assessing eligibility. At the end of this process, the entire survey data for each State was shared with respective State Handloom Departments to cross-check data points so that any correction can be carried out within the overall fieldwork period.

This chapter specifically looks at the characteristics of the households who have weavers with or without allied workers.

3.2 Socio-demographic profile of Weaver Households

This segment of the report explores the sociodemographic profile of weaver households in terms of their distribution by location, gender and age of weavers, their religious affiliations and social category, and the intensity of engagements from within a household in terms of average number of workers.

3.2.1 Number and distribution

A total of 25,45,312 weaver households have been enumerated in this survey. The total number of weavers in these households are 26,73,891. This means at an all-India level the average number of weavers per household in the handloom sector is 1.05. This is 1.04 in rural areas and 1.10 in urban areas, which could be indicating that there are more earning opportunities from weaving in urban areas. Out of the total number of weaver households, 10,456 were master weaver households. These households have reported a total of 10,623 weavers. At an all India level, the top 3 States are Assam (10,009), West Bengal (413) and Karnataka (171).


Four States of India account for 18 lakhs of all weaver households in the country. These States are Assam (10.9 lakhs) households, West Bengal (3.4 lakhs), Manipur (2.1 lakhs) and Tamil Nadu (1.7 lakhs).

Further, among these 25,45,312 weaver households, there are a total of 1,72,911 weaver households that have reported 2,10,751 allied workers as well. This number is considerably lower than weavers since most weavers are also performing the allied activities themselves. A detailed account of allied workers within weaver households have been provided in Chapter 4.

3.2.2 Demographic Profile of Weavers

22.5 lakhs (88.7%) weaver households are located in rural areas while 2.8 lakhs (11.3%) are in urban areas. At an aggregate level, nearly 72% of handloom weavers are female. While this is primarily a reflection of the gender mix among weavers in rural India, the distribution by gender is nearly even in the urban areas (refer Figure 3.1).

Across both urban and rural areas, the share of weavers aged 14 – 18 years is 2.4% only. One observation that emerges from this survey is that since involvement of family members in the age range of 14 years to less than 18 years is very low, this is perhaps indicative of the fact that moving forward, it can be a challenge to involve the next generation workers from such households to be actively involved in the traditional weaving activities.

3.2.3 Social profile of allied workers


The social profile of allied worker households has been analysed on the basis of three key indicators, viz.

- · Their religious affiliation;
- · Their caste; and
- The last completed level of education of the workers themselves.

The following sections elaborate on the survey findings.


As depicted in the Figure 3.2, at an aggregate level the profiling of the weaver households reveals that higher percentage of households belong to the Hindu faith (74.8%) followed by

Muslim households (16.4%). While this trend is very similar across urban and rural geographies, the share of Muslim households in the handloom sector is nearly seven percentage points higher in the urban areas as against rural. States with the highest proportion of weavers belonging to the Muslim faith are Jammu & Kashmir (92.7%), Uttar Pradesh (83.1%), Jharkhand (74.7%), Uttarakhand (53.9%) and Meghalaya (53.4%).

At an aggregate level, close to 31.3% of the weavers belong to general caste households (refer Figure 3.3). This trend is found to be similar across both urban and rural areas. But the largest social category is represented by OBCs (34.6%), especially in urban areas where nearly 49.7% of the weaver households are from other backward classes. SCs and STs brought up the balance of 34% of weaver households but their share in urban areas is relatively low (less than 1 in 5). However, the share of ST households among all weaver households as per the current Handloom Census is higher at 19.9%. Apart from the north-eastern States (excluding Assam) and Sikkim, where the share of ST households among all surveyed weaver households, within States, is expected to be highest in the country, Bihar (57%) also has a significantly high ST population engaged in weaving.

Nearly one in four weavers have not received any formal education while a further 14% have not completed primary level (refer Figure 3.4). It may be surprising to note that a higher proportion of female weavers are middle school and high school; education than their male counterparts. States with the most educated weavers (completed high school or more) are Goa (68.2%), Maharashtra (60.6%), Manipur (40.6%), Telangana (33.6%) and Himachal Pradesh (32.6%).

At this juncture it would also be worthwhile to look at the education level of weavers across urban and rural geographies.

As the above Table 3.1 indicates, while urban residents are more literate than their rural counterparts at least till the level of basic education (5 years of formal schooling), beyond that educational achievement is nearly identical between workers living in either geography.

3.3 Economic profile of weaver households


Economic status of weaver households has been analysed on the basis of four key indicators, viz.


- · Type of dwelling in which they reside;
- Average household income from all sources;
- Share of income from handloom related activities;
- · Penetration of banking services;
- · Debt status and access to formal credit; and
- · Social security

The following section elaborates on each of the above using data from the survey findings.


Figure 3.5: Distribution of weaver households by type of dwellings (in %; base=25,45,312)

At an aggregate level, 61.2% of the weaver households live in kuccha homes, while only 18.4% live in pucca structures (refer Figure 3.5). As per the NSS 69th round (July to Dec 2012), 61.9% of Indian families live in pucca homes. The preponderance of pucca housing is more in

Figure 3.4: Gender-wise educational qualification of weavers (in %; base = 26,73,891)





urban areas than rural areas, which is very much in line how Indian housing pattern is distributed in general.

Majority (66.3%) of the weaver households earn less than Rs.5,000/- a month (refer Figure 3.6).

It may be mentioned here that 25.2% of the weaver households are Antodaya card holders. A little more than a quarter of the households earn between 5,000 and 10,000 a month while just 7.4% have a monthly income in excess of Rs.10,000. 36.1% of weaver households from urban areas earn more than Rs.5,000 a month as compared to only 25.1% living in rural areas. Relatively low income from the sector is perhaps the key determinant behind the fall in average number of weavers per household between the

two censuses, from 1.28 in the Third census to 1.05 in the current census.

There are 3 States where 60% or more of the weaver households have earned in excess of Rs.5000 per month. These are Goa (95.5%), Uttarakhand (69.8%), and Maharashtra (60.3%). The survey further reveals that for 82.5% of weaver households, the earnings from handloom activities alone stands at less than Rs.5,000 per month. Given that for 66.3% of the households the overall household monthly income is less than Rs.5,000, this would imply that for a sizeable segment of weaver households, weaving is the only income activity.

3.3.1 Penetration of banking services

Out of the total of 26.73 lakhs weavers who have been enumerated, 23.3% have a bank account (refer Table 3.2). Banking penetration among weavers is higher among urban households (41.8%) than those living in rural areas (only 20.8%). Further, penetration is higher among male weavers (37.8%) than female weavers (only 17.6%).

Some of the larger States with the highest banking penetration among their weaver community are Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Tamil Nadu and Rajasthan. States with very low penetrations include Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Bihar, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Meghalaya and Tripura with Delhi reporting nil penetration.

3.3.2 Debt status and access to formal credit

Only about 3.4% of the weaver households carry any kind of debt/loan; this is similar for both urban and rural areas. This is a very low percentage to analyse any further but nevertheless, the survey data reveals that nearly 40% of this debt is related to loans taken for handloom activities while 59% is loans for other purposes. Nearly 75.8% of the debt taken has been from formal sources, including cooperatives, commercial banks, and Government schemes.

3.3.3 Social security

The survey data clearly indicates that at an aggregate level, insurance penetration (life or health) is very low among weaver households (3.8%). Though only 7%, the penetration of insurance among urban weavers is over double that of rural areas (3.3%).

The States with the highest recorded insurance penetration among weavers are Telangana (12.7%), Odisha (10.5%), Kerala (10.4%), Chhattisgarh (10.1%), Andhra Pradesh (9.8%) and Maharashtra (9.8%).

Figure 3.7: Insurance penetration among weavers (in %; base = 25,45,312)





Figure 3.9: Average days of engagement by states




3.4 Work engagement

This section of the present chapter looks at the following key indicators that defile terms of engagement, viz.

- Average number of days of engagement in a year;
- Engagement status, i.e. full or part time engagement; and
- Distribution by employer typology.

The person days of engagement per household has been arrived at by adding the total number of days of engagement by each weaver in a household in the past one year. Among the 26.73 lakhs weavers enumerated, the average number of person days of engagement in weaving activity is 208 days in the past one year. Engagement opportunities are more for workers residing in urban areas (262 days) as against those in rural areas (201 days). In comparison, the average number of person days of engagement was 183 days during the Third Handloom Census.

The top five States with highest average number of person days of work are Maharashtra (310), Andhra Pradesh (302), Delhi (292), Chhattisgarh (290) and Puducherry (286) and. The average number of person days of engagement in weaving activity is 208 days in the past one year (refer Figure 3.8). Given that the average number of weavers per household is 1.05, it assumes that most such households have a single weaver and therefore, a work engagement in excess of 200 days implies that they are all main workers in the handloom sector (the census of India defines main workers as those who are engaged in gainful employment for at least 180 days a year).

At this juncture it would also be worthwhile to look at the engagement level of weavers across urban and rural geographies.

Overall engagement in weaving activities is of full time nature, more so among male workers (75.6%). However, the exception is that in rural areas, there are more women weavers engaged in this activity as a part time endeavour (nearly two in three) (refer Table 3.3). States where the majority of the weavers work part time in



this sector include Himachal Pradesh (89%), Nagaland (89%), Meghalaya(86%), Assam (80%), Sikkim (78%), Arunachal Pradesh (70%) and Tripura (62%).

Distribution of weavers by employer typology throws up stark differences between urban and rural areas. First of all, nearly 82% of weavers in rural areas work independently, i.e. are self-employed; in urban areas, this is nearly 51%. In fact, in urban areas nearly 1 in 3 weavers work with master weaver, while this is only 12.1% in rural areas. Few weavers (nearly 6.3%) are engaged with cooperative societies engaged in handloom activities. States where the weavers are more organised (working under a co-operative society, under KVIC/KVIB, or with SHDC), include Goa (95%), Kerala (71%), Puducherry (91%) and Tamil Nadu (56%).

There are significant differences in the nature of engagement between male and female weavers (refer Table 3.4). A higher proportion of women weavers are self-employed than their male counterparts. Further, while over a quarter of the male weavers work under a master weaver, this proportion is below 10% in case of female weavers, who prefer to work independently.

Figure 3.10: Distribution of weavers by employer typology (in %; base = 26,73,891)



3.5 Awareness and access to schemes and benefits

3.5.1 Affiliations and memberships of weaver households


Three types of affiliations are found to be of existence amongst the 25.45 lakhs weaver households, viz. membership in co-operative societies, membership in any SHG or Joint Liability Group of similar nature, and Producer Company. However, the survey indicates that membership penetration is limited, the highest being 26.1% in co-operative societies in urban area (refer Table 3.5). As a generic trend,

membership in co-operative societies and being associated with a producer company is higher in the urban areas (as compared to rural) but more importantly, the survey has found that in most cases half or even less proportion of those associated with a group/body has gained any tangible benefit from the membership.

3.5.2 Awareness levels of relevant schemes for enabling weaver households

A total of 13 schemes have been selected a priori for testing of awareness among the target audience, each of which is deemed to have the potential of directly benefitting a weaver,

and their household at an indirect level. These shortlisted schemes include those that improve financial access, provide social security, exposure to markets, skill upgradation, subsidised material supply, and access to production facilities.

The survey reveals that majority of the weaver household members are not aware of various schemes available to enable them in the allied activities of handlooms. Response on lack of awareness on the existing schemes, trainings and other enablers is more than 65% and beyond for each of the listed items; in fact, for 9 out of the 13 listed schemes, awareness levels was below 15%. Having said that, the highest awareness have been recorded against initiatives like housing scheme (33.1%), design training (25.5%), , and common facility centre/calendaring machine (22.4%) and handloom mark (22.4%) (Refer Figure 3.11).

A very small section of weavers who are aware of individual schemes designed for their benefit have gone on to benefit from the same. It is interesting to note that for all schemes, benefitted households from those who are aware range from 15% to 56%. Schemes which led to lowest benefits are schemes related to Common Facility Centre/ Calendaring Machine (15%) and; Housing scheme (16.3%); while the highest benefits were accrued for the scheme related to Skill upgradation. But given that awareness itself is below 15% in case of 9 out of the 13 schemes listed, it can be concluded that if awareness can be raised, the handloom weavers community could utilise the benefits for economic gains.

3.5.3 Support required by weaver households





Figure 3.12: Nature of support needed by weaver households (in %; base = 25,45,312)

Weavers have also been asked to share their views on the nature of support that they require in carrying out their activities and realise a sustainable living. A bucket list of nine activities that could support an allied worker to better perform his/her tasks are presented as a prompt. The following Figure 3.12 presents the findings. Overall, it is quite apparent that most of the weaver families can clearly elucidate their support requirements. Most (60%) need raw material support. All other forms of support, including training to technology upgrades to marketing support, is mentioned by 51-58% of the households that have participated in this survey. Assam has the highest number of households who have asked for support which shows the dominance of the weaving tradition and the desire to keep it going.

3.5.4 Availability of Aadhar Card

Out of the total of 26,73,891 weavers enumerated as part of this Census, only 15,16,382 (or 56.7%) have been issued Aadhar cards. This is a significantly low number, possibly because issuing of Aadhar cards in Assam and Meghalaya started only in March 2018 (border sensitivity and illegal immigration issues). If we remove these two States from the overall aggregate, then Aadhar penetration among weavers stands at 96.7%. In the State of Assam, which accounts for nearly 1.10 lakhs weavers, Aadhar penetration at the time of the survey shows only 3.6%.

Chapter 4

Allied Workers

4.1 Introduction

Allied activities form a key input to complete a finished weaving product. For the purpose of this census, major allied activities have been categorised under pre-loom and postloom activities. The pre-loom activities consist of winding, warping, tying and dyeing, sizing, dyeing, loom setting and manual card punching. Only calendaring has been considered as a post loom activity. Till activities like winding and warping are not undertaken, a product or a fabric cannot be given its basic structure and shape. Further, activities like tying and dyeing help to provide a fabric with rich designs and colour while sizing provides strength to the fabric. New loom setting is just as much significant since this activity ensures that while weaving, there is no break in the pattern envisaged by the weaver. It is a time consuming activity but a very crucial aspect of the weaving process. Card punching also ensures that fabric patterns can be woven as planned by the weaver. The post loom activity of calendaring involves giving the product/ fabric a smooth finish and appearance by removing all the dust or dirt particles.

An allied worker is someone who undertakes only pre-loom and/ or post-loom activities. Allied workers are found in both weaver households as well as in allied worker household. An allied household is one which does not have weavers or looms. In the Third Handloom Census, 3.91 lakhs allied worker households were covered. In the current census, a total of 5,99,527 allied households with 6,37,870 allied workers and 1,72,911 weaver households with 2,10,751 allied workers have been covered. Thus, a total of 8,48,621 allied workers have been reported,



of whom 82.2% live in rural areas. This chapter specifically looks at the characteristics of allied workers belonging to both weaver as well as allied worker households. In the chapter when reporting of data is at a combined base of weaver and allied households, it will be mentioned as handloom worker households. Goa and Sikkim have not reported any allied workers from weaver households.

4.2 Socio-demographic profile of Allied Workers

This section of the report seeks to present a profile of allied households by gender and age of the workers engaged in allied activities, their religious affiliations and social category, and the intensity of engagements from within a household in terms of average number of workers.


4.2.1 Intensity of engagement

A total of 8.48.621 allied workers have been covered under the Fourth All India Handloom Census, out of which 6,37,870 allied workers are working in 5,99,527 allied households, and 2,10,751 allied workers are working in 1,72,911 weaver households. This means, at an all-India level the average number of allied workers engaged per household in allied activities in the handloom sector is 1.09. There is no difference between urban and rural areas in this respect. However, average number of allied workers from allied households is 1.06 while average number of allied workers from weaver households is 1.21. There are State level variations that needs mentioning at the overall level. The highest average number of allied workers per handloom workers household is in Bihar at 1.42. This is followed by Odisha (1.41), Uttar Pradesh (1.29), Jharkhand (1.28) and Delhi (1.24).

4.2.2 Demographic Profile of Allied Workers

Across both urban and rural areas, the share of allied workers aged 14 – 18 years from allied households is only 3.8% whereas share of allied workers aged 14 – 18 years in weaver households in 9.4%. One observation that emerges from this survey is that the involvement of family members in the age range of 14 years to less than 18 years is very low among allied households. This perhaps indicates that moving forward, it will be a challenge to involve the next generation workers from such allied households to be actively involved in the pre-loom and post-loom activities.

Figure 4.1: Distribution of allied workers by gender (in %; base = 8,48,621




Overall, a higher number of females are involved in allied activities. In fact, female work force participation rate in allied activities in this sector is twice as much higher than their male counterpart. This trend is true for both urban and rural areas.

4.2.3 Social profile of allied workers

The social profile of allied worker households has been analysed on the basis of three key indicators, viz.

- · Their religious affiliation;
- · Their caste; and
- The last completed level of education of the workers themselves

The following sections elaborate on the survey findingsfindings.

As depicted in the Figure 4.2, at an aggregate level the profiling reveals that higher percentage of handloom worker households covered in the census are of Hindu faith (70.7%) followed by Muslim households (23.2%). This trend is similar across urban and rural areas. However, Muslim

Figure 4.3: Distribution of allied worker in handloom workers households by caste (in %, base = 7,72,438)





Figure 4.4: Gender-wise educational qualification of allied workers (in %; base = 8,48,621)



allied workers from weaver households are at 26.9% compared to Muslim allied workers from allied households which are at 22.1%.

At an aggregate level, close to 37.6% of the allied workers belong to general caste/ Other households (refer Figure 4.3). Urban areas are dominated by those belonging to the OBC category. However, the survey reveals that for allied workers belonging to weaver households, at an overall level, OBC dominates (53%), followed by General (28.5%), SCs (9.7%) and STs (8.7%). For allied workers belonging to allied households, at an overall level, general category dominates (40.2%), followed by OBCs (29%) and SCs and STs both around 15%.

In terms of share of SC households within total handloom worker households, there are two (2) States which have recorded a percentage in excess of 20%, are West Bengal (32.2%) and Assam (22.7%).

Scheduled tribes constitute 8.6% of this country's population as per the 2011 population census. However, the share of ST households among all allied worker households as per the current Handloom Census is higher, at 14.2%.

Apart from the north-eastern States (excluding Assam) and Sikkim, where the share of ST households among all surveyed handloom worker households is expected to be highest in the country, some of the other States with a sizeable share of tribal communities in this sector include Bihar (59.4%), Haryana (19.2%), Jharkhand (17.9%), Jammu & Kashmir (17%) and Odisha (13.5%).

27.1% of the females engaged as allied workers in this sector have either not received any formal education or have not completed primary level (refer Figure 4.4). For male workers, this number is slightly lower, at 20.5%.

An examination of allied workers from allied households reveals that while 26.5% females allied workers have either not received any formal education or not completed primary as compared to male which is lower at 20.5%. Mostly female allied workers have completed up to high school (64.4%). Male allied workers, in general, are more educated.

Similarly, among allied workers from weaver households it was found that 28.5% female works and 16.7% of the male workers have

either not received formal education or not completed primary.

In general it appears that female allied workers will have fewer opportunities to skill up using any formal training programs given their lack of basic education.

At this juncture it is worthwhile to look at the education level of allied workers from such households across urban and rural geographies.

As the above Table 4.1 indicates, allied workers among weaver households are far less educated.

4.3 Work engagement

This section of the report looks at the following key indicators that define terms of engagement, viz.

- Average number of days of engagement in a year;
- Engagement status, i.e. full or part time engagement; and
- Distribution by employer typology.

Figure 4.5: Average number of person days of work in different States for allied workers from allied households; (base = 6,37,870)





Figure 4.6: Average number of person days of work in different States for allied workers from weaver households; (base = 2,10,751)


The person days of engagement per household has been arrived at by adding the total number of days of engagement by each allied worker in a household in the past one year. The average number of person days of engagement in allied activities by allied households are much lower than their weaver household counterparts (refer Table 4.2). This implies that they could be earning from other sources of employment. Engagement opportunities are more for workers residing in urban areas as against those in rural areas.

The top three States for allied workers, from allied households, with maximum average man days of work are Chhattisgarh (334), Andhra Pradesh (261) and Odisha (261); while for those belonging to weaver households are Haryana (309), Andhra Pradesh (285). And Punjab (274). Overall engagement in allied activities is of part time nature, more so among male workers. As the above table suggests (refer table 4.3), most male workers from allied households in rural

areas are engaged in this activity as a part time worker (54.6%) but the situation is reverse in urban areas where a higher proportion of male workers are engaged full time (62.2%). However, for female allied workers, full time engagement is predominant among allied households situated in urban areas. Full time participation among allied workers, in general, from weaver households is quite low.

Distribution of allied workers by employer typology throws up stark differences between urban and rural areas. First of all, nearly 2 in 3 workers in rural areas work independently, i.e. are self-employed. In fact, in urban areas nearly half of the allied workers work with master weavers, while this is only 31.2% in rural areas. Very few allied workers are engaged with SHDC or KVIC, though around 10% in urban areas do work with/for cooperative societies engaged in handloom activities. Here there is no difference between allied workers belonging to allied or weaver households.

Chapter 5

Non-households

5.1 Introduction

The bulk of the handloom sector is unorganised. However, there are lots of non-household establishments which also contribute to handloom production in many ways, be it in the form of providing space for weavers to place their looms, providing production opportunity even if weavers do not own looms, providing support in procuring materials, support like training, ideating on trends, etc. The Third Census had attempted to conduct the enumeration of these establishments but was unable to complete the process due to several factors including resistance from owners (explained in the Third Handloom Census Report). However, the Fourth Handloom Census has been successful in conducting the enumeration for nonhouseholds in totality. In the Fourth Handloom Census, non-household units are those which have a shed/ area and have looms/ weaving/ allied work being performed within that premises, and there is any type of signboard stating name of the entity and their primary affiliation/registration status is considered for enumeration.

The types of entities identified for enumeration are master weavers, co-operative societies, units run by Government/corporations, producer groups, private companies, and others. However, during both the pilot studies the experience has been that master weavers do not put up a board and usually tend to operate from their homes/ sheds or have the work distributed among their workers. Therefore, it is not feasible to identify them as a non-household unit on face value. Herein information on master weavers has been captured as households but with an inclusion criteria that individuals who not only engage workers (weavers and allied workers) but more than 50% of those workers are hired and are not other members of the master weavers'

household would qualify as master weavers. The analysis of findings for master weavers has been presented in Chapter 3: Weaver Households.


This chapter presents an analysis of the survey findings pertaining to non-households (co-operative societies, units being run by Government/ corporations, producer groups, companies and others).

5.2 Type of entity

A total of 5,457 units are covered under the Fourth Handloom Census. The majority (70.3%) are Co-operative societies followed by units run by Others (13.6%). The trend is very similar across urban and rural areas (refer Figure 5.1). In this Census, the State of Meghalaya has not reported any non-household unit. The five

biggest States in terms share of such units to the total count of 5,457 are Assam (31.3%), Tamil Nadu (14.7%), Nagaland (11.7%), Uttar Pradesh (7.9%) and Kerala (5.9%). Once again, in these five States, there is very little difference in distribution by typology between the rural and urban areas.

5.3 Engagement of workers


A total of 1,95,111 handloom workers are employed by these units. The average worker per unit is around 36. Rural workers constitute 65.9% of the workforce engaged in such units. The top States in terms of enumerated workforce in non-household units are Tamil Nadu (30.3%), Uttar Pradesh (22.1%), Kerala (10.4%), Haryana (6.4%) and Assam (5%).

5.4 Looms

An in-depth analysis of looms and their usage pattern has been shown in Chapter 6: Looms; in this section, we have presented a brief analysis of ownership and working status of looms in non-household units across urban and rural geographies.

As far as ownership is concerned, these 5,457 units account for 1,22,302 looms in all. However, not all the looms are owned by the unit/proprietor concerned. Premises of non-households are also used as production hubs where looms owned by weavers, were placed for their work, especially in case of cooperative societies.

The survey also looks at the working status of the looms that are owned by these non-household units. The data reveals that at an aggregate level, these looms are active (work is being performed using them).



Figure 5.3: Distribution of looms by working status





Figure 5.4: Reasons for Idle looms (in %, base=3,281)



Non-households can own looms that can be either be placed at their own premises or even at other places (say, weaver's housheolds). These looms can be either working or idle looms. Also, working looms and idle looms can be owned/ placed by individual owners who use the unit's premises as a resource centrecum-workshed. In essence, the total number of looms located within the premises of non-household units are a little over 1.5 lakhs. Looms owned by non-household units but placed elsewhere have not be considered in this count to void any double counting.

Idle looms have been reported by 3,281 units out of the 5,457 non-household units. The major reasons for owned looms remaining idle are three, viz. lack of market demand (49.6%), non-availability of weavers (27.5%), and lack of capital/ funds (22.9%). Here we notice that in urban areas, the issue of non-availability of workers is a bigger issue (40.9%), while in rural areas the biggest issue is lack of market demand (53.2%).

Chapter 6

Looms


The process of weaving primarily constitutes interlacement of two sets of threads, viz. warp and weft, and the equipment which operates this interlacement is called 'loom'. At its rudimentary form, a handloom is made up of a stick or wooden frame for weaving but more often it is defined as a frame for weaving which is equipped with some wooden devices. In India various types of looms are traditionally in practice and they can be identified through the nature of cloth produced or the places of their origin. Some of the most common handlooms in India are the loin loom, pit loom, frame loom, Manipuri loom, Rajasthani loom, Kashmiri loom, etc.

Successive handlooms censuses have established that pit looms are the most widely used handlooms in India. Even today the finest varieties of fabrics with their beautiful designs and textures are produced on throw shuttle pit looms. These would typically include the famous 'brocades' of Varanasi, the 'Jamdanies' of Tanda, the 'Patola' Saris of Patan, the Himroos' of Aurangabad, to mention only a few. As the name implies, the loom stands over a pit and the process of picking is done by throwing the shuttle across the sley by hand.

Frame looms have come into existence due to certain advantages they have in weaving designed varieties with more than two treadles. These are also helpful in weaving fabric requiring mass production and are usually employed in manufacturing items on a large scale.

Throughout the States in the North East Region, weaving is an integral part of the culture, and the uniqueness about the weaving in this region is the use of the loin loom. It is also referred to as back-strap or body tension loom and is one of the oldest devices for weaving cloth. Mostly

made from bamboo, the loin looms are simple in construction and easy to use. They have neither permanent fixtures nor heavy frames and so are easily portable. Apart from these, the greatest advantage that lies with these looms is the unlimited scope that they offer for designing. Although this age old loom is a simple device, the products woven on it vary in texture, colour and design with every tribe has three or more distinctive cloths of its own.

Across India, 28.2 lakhs handlooms were reported in the Fourth All-India Handloom Census, out of which 25.2 lakhs were in rural areas and 2.9 lakhs were located in urban areas. Handlooms are mostly located in handloom weaver households (95.6%) which clearly signify that weaving on handlooms is primarily a household based activity.

As far as distribution of looms by typology is concerned, in rural India 41.7% of the looms are pit looms, 31.8% are frame looms, 15.3 % are loin looms while 11.2% are of all other types taken together. In urban areas, 53.1% are pit looms and 30.2% are frame looms. Loin looms are not as popular in urban areas, with less than 6% penetration.


Weavers themselves primarily own pit looms (42.2%), followed by frame looms (31.5%). Nonhouseholds also have more pit looms (57%) than frame looms (32.5%). On the other hand, master weavers prefer frame looms (55%) over other types of looms. 67.3% of all pit looms are with Dobby/Jacquard. At the same time, only 32.6% of frame looms are with Dobby/Jacquard.

followed by master weavers who have 5.3% idle looms. The primary reasons responsible for looms remaining idle are lack of capital/funds and inadequate market demand for handloom products.

Chapter 7

Production

7.1 Production of major fabrics

From the point of view of undertaking a Handloom Census, the count of handloom units across different States is intrinsically linked with the choice of which fabrics are to be considered 'major'. Since the count is very high in the North Eastern States and the States of West Bengal, Tamil Nadu and Uttar Pradesh, the fabrics produced in these States are counted as major fabrics. The present chapter thus presents production information on these major fabrics, as well as key fabrics being produced by the major handloom States. It is expected that this will then provide an understanding of the specialisation in terms of fabrics in different parts of the country. A distribution of the major fabrics being produced by households include:

Saree: 22.9% (being produced by approximately 6.83 lakhs weaver households)

Shawls, Mekhla Chadder, Loi, stole, scarf, muffler: 26.7% (being produced by approximately 7.97lakhs weaver households)

Angavastram, dhoti, sarong, lungi: 19.5% (being produced by approximately 5.80 lakhs weaver households)

Towel, napkin, duster, gamcha: 16.5% (being produced by approximately 4.91lakhs weaver households)

Durries, rugs, mats: 3.5% (being produced by approximately 1.01 lakhs weaver and allied worker households)

Dress material (Salwar, kameez, etc.), suiting, shirting, long cloth: 3.2% (being produced by approximately 0.95 lakhs weaver households)

Bedsheet, furnishings, blankets: 3.4% (being produced by approximately 1.01 lakhs weaver households)

All others, including surgical bandage: 4.3% (being produced by approximately 1.27 lakhs weaver households)

Not all major cloths are woven in every part of the country; in fact, apart from a few exceptions there are distinct specialisations to be found that are geographically localised. The following Table 7.1 will show that even though there are some States which, by virtue of their large weaver population, does account for sizeable portion of the production of several of these major fabrics, there is a distinct case to be made for region – specific specialisation in production.

7.2 Usage of different types of yarns


At an aggregate level (refer Figure 7.1), the Fourth Handloom Census reveals that in terms of preference, the largest yarn type used by handloom weavers in India is Cotton 1 to 20, which is being used by 30.4% of all weavers and allied workers. This is followed by Cotton (21-80) which is being used by 27.5% of the handloom workers; and this is followed by Cotton (>80), which is being used by 9.3% of the workers.

Among the more exclusive silk blends, the most popular yarn is Muga silk (being used by 4.3% of workers), followed by Eri silk (used by 2.2%

of the workers). Wool is being used by close to 7.9% of the workers. More exclusive yarns like Acrylic wool and Zari are individually being used by a bit more than 2% of the weavers and allied workers as market for fabrics made from these raw materials are niche. There is a market in India and abroad for fabrics made out of linen (1.4%) and polyester blends (2.6%) and this demand has ensured that both yarns types are being used by weavers/allied workers.

The following Table 7.2 presents an overview of the yarn usage across the country by looking at the top three user States (by proportion of total weavers and allied workers) by yarn type.

7.3 Source of raw materials


This section looks at source of procurement of various raw materials by weavers and allied workers. The input materials that have been considered includes hank yarn, dyes and chemicals, and dyed yarn.

7.3.1 Sourcing of hank yarn

In the textile sector, a hank is a coiled or wrapped unit of yarn or twine. This is often the best form for use with hand looms, compared to the cone form needed for power looms. Hanks come in varying lengths depending on the type of material and the manufacturer.

At an aggregate level, 3 out of 4 weavers/ allied workers source hank yarn from the open market. This is certainly the case in rural India but weavers situated in urban areas have other prominent sources as well, viz. from master weavers (21.2%) and from cooperative societies (13.6%).

7.3.2 Sourcing of dyes and chemicals


Dyeing is one of the most important value addition processes in the handloom sector. The dyeing process is either carried out by the yarn trader before selling the yarn or on fabric by weaver. At the cluster, i.e. local level, 60% of the yarn is sold in the grey (kora) form and about 40% is dyed before selling.

The handloom sector consumes a variety of dyes and chemicals. These dyes and chemicals are sourced mainly from the States of Gujarat and Maharashtra by the wholesaling agents and these in turn are distributed to the handloom sector (the dyeing units) either directly by the

wholesalers or through dealers located near the handloom units. The main classes of dyes that are consumed in this sector for processing primarily the cotton fabrics are Vats, Napthols, Bases, Reactives, Directs and Sulphur Black. Very limited number of purely organic dyes is sometimes used like Organic Blue but they are not much popular due to their high price and less availability and suitability. However, in recent years, there has been a shift in interest towards dyes produced from natural objects like fruits, flowers and vegetables.

The survey data reveals that at an aggregate level, for the sourcing of dyes and chemicals it is nearly 6 out of 10 buy from the open market, while 18.9% procure the same from master weavers and 13.4%, from cooperative societies. Procuring dyes and chemicals from master weavers is at 39% in urban areas but not so much among rural weavers (refer Figure 7.3).

7.3.3 Sourcing of dyed yarn

Yarn dyed fabric is woven from material that has already been dyed, while piece dyed is coloured after the fabric has been woven. So a dyed yarn would refer to yarn that was dyed before the product was woven. Dyeing is the application of dyes or pigments on textile materials such as fibres, yarns, and fabrics with the objective of achieving colour with desired fastness. Dyeing is normally done in a special solution containing dyes and particular chemical material.

The survey data reveals that at an overall level, open market sources dominate 50% of all purchases made by handloom workers.

Figure 7.4: Sourcing of dyed yarn by handloom worker households (in %; base = 31,44,839)





Figure 7.5: Source of sales by handloom households (in %; base = 31,44,839)



However, in rural areas, it is slightly higher and purchases made from open market are at 53.4%. While 35.3% of all handloom workers purchase their dyed yarn from master weavers, 32.1% of the weavers/allied workers in rural India buy dyed yarn from master weavers, but this is major at 53.9% in urban areas.


Therefore, it may be concluded that by and large raw material purchase happens through the open market and master weavers, certainly so in rural areas where the bulk of the weavers live.

7.4 Source of sales

A total 31,44,839 weaver and allied worker households have been enumerated as part of this Census exercise. Out of these 64.1% sell their produce in the local market making this the most-used marketing method for the weavers/ allied workers of this country. 17.6% sell their products to the master weavers to whom they are affiliated and from whom they source orders as well as raw materials. About 8.8% of the

produce are sold through cooperative societies (refer Figure 7.5). But use of organised fairs, e-commerce portals, or exports, is yet to become popular among the direct manufacturers. It seems that the benefits of using the web for greater outreach or representation and visibility on organised fairs have really benefitted the people who source the products from the primary producers and therefore reap the benefits of the inflated margin money.

Here it may be noted that weavers and allied households located in our towns and cities have greater access to a captured market provided by the master weavers who engage individual families as contractual job workers. In the urban context, 39.8% of the sales happen in local markets followed by 35.3% to Master weavers. However, in the rural areas, 67.5% is sold in the local market followed by only 15.1% to master weavers. In essence, selling back produce to master weavers is not a sale but rather, a fulfilment of an order.

Census Approach and Methodology

A.1 Introduction

The present chapter describes in detail the overall approach adopted by KDMSL for delivering the Fourth Handloom Census, including activities related to planning and preparation, and all protocols adopted for field operations, quality control and validations of data. It will be evident in the forthcoming sections that this process of conducting a census not only involved survey personnel on the ground, but also many other stakeholders including handloom/ textiles

related officials at district/ State and central levels, many of whom contributed their time and expertise towards successful completion of this exercise. Due diligence was followed at all stages to ensure that the unit level data can be shared in the public domain (barring contact details, socio-economic status, photographs, and financial status) for beneficiaries to check their inclusion

The following diagram provides an outline of the overall process followed for this project. The

process flow has been further broken down into a four stages of activities performed at different stages of the project. All elaboration of each activity has been taken up in later sections.

A.1.1 Pre-field activities

At the very outset, the Office of the Development Commissioner (Handlooms) had set up an Advisory Committee to oversee the launch of this project. This consisted of officials from the central department and also from major handloom States, representatives from Ministry of Labour and Employment, Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation, National Sample Survey Office and Crafts Council of India, and senior staff representing the KDMSL project team. This Committee provided guidance on all the concepts and definitions and deliberated on the pilot exercises. When examining the definitions, for comparability it was decided by the Committee that two key definitions would be kept the same from the previous Census, viz.:

- 1) Any person who has engaged in weaving and allied activities in the last one year was to be enumerated
- 2) Any village where there was less than 5 weaver households will not to be visited

Questionnaire approval, pilot study, and approval of training manual

The Advisory Committee had ensured that all sections (and questions within sections) across the household and non-households questionnaires¹ very robust were comprehensive, For example, definitions for inclusions of non-household, master weavers, intricacy of weaves, consolidation of fabrics, extension of number of yarns, updation of sources for sales and inputs were all incorporated. Pilot testing was conducted in Hyderabad and New Delhi to get a first-hand feedback on the ease of understanding at the level of the respondent, length of interview, and improvisations required.

The final approved questionnaires (household and non-household) had taken into account all of this feedback. Further, the questionnaires were used as the basis for designing the field operations manual training. Definitions used in

the manual were taken from several sources, including the Socio Economic Caste Census manual, Third All India Handloom Census, and from the Advisory Committee for new terms that were being introduced for the first time in this census. This training manual included a lot of pictorial evidence which were used as prompts by enumerators to help respondents identify various allied activities, including type of weaves (for gauging intricacy of work), etc. This was done to maximize field level accuracy of data inputs. These pictures were uploaded into the data capture application and appeared as information icons for ease of access during the interview.

District data mapping and Mobile application finalization

63

During the application design, it was mandatory to load all the codes for villages, blocks, districts and States at the backend. While the starting point was the list of all villages covered during the third census, an entire State's district and village wise data had to be updated as the field agency did not know which additional villages would be covered over and above the list from the third census. While the master list was taken from the Primary Census Abstract (Census 2011), it was also cross checked with data from www.lqdirectory.qov.in to take into account district re-alignment. Since the last census was conducted in 2010-11, a total of 14 States had undergone re-alignment of districts and hence, accurate village re-assignment was required. These States were Andhra Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Chhattisgarh, Delhi, Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Meghalaya, Punjab, Telangana, Tripura, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal.

In addition to English, the questionnaires were translated in 10 regional languages. All vernacular versions were beta tested from start to finish in the app to ensure that records were being saved. The entire backend was checked thoroughly and all glitches addressed before approval for launch of the application.

There were certain questions for which information buttons were embedded along with the query in the application. This was done to allow enumerators to use visual aids to elicit accurate responses. There were 7 information buttons which were developed:

Training of trainers


A Training of the Trainers (ToT) session was organized by the survey agency to train around 90 staff across Kolkata, Hyderabad and New Delhi, following which the app-based questionnaire in major regional languages was tested by these people before it was released for fieldwork launch. The attendees of the ToT formed the backbone of the project throughout its duration, handling State level recruitment, training, micro-planning and routing, field operations, and interaction with State and district handloom officials.


Recruitment of enumerators and supervisors


their training: Following the recruitment of enumerators was carried out at district levels in each State. It was ensured that all enumerators were locally recruited so that they can carry out survey work in their own districts. Without exception all enumerators were at least Class XII pass outs, were well versed in operation of a smartphone, and owned a 5.1 inch mobile phone (minimum dimension) with Android features and camera. During these State level trainings, not only were all the concepts explained, but all enumerators had to practice on the application to familiarize themselves on data sync, back buttons and information buttons. During the initial days of fieldwork in all States, team supervisors accompanied the enumerators to ensure comprehension and accuracy of administration of the survey protocols. It may also be noted that because fieldwork spanned more than a year, there was attrition among the field force (both supervisory and enumerator level). To overcome this challenge, continuous recruitment and district level trainings had to be ensured. For every 10 enumerators, 1 supervisor was assigned.

A major reason for fresh recruitment at field level was because by the time district level online validation happened and missing weaver/ allied worker data was provided by the district administration, some of enumerators had moved on to other assignments. Hence,

new teams in many districts had to be recruited for undertaking the mop-up exercise. Further, in Assam and Manipur, which saw devastating floods in 2017, fieldwork had to be stopped for a couple of months leading to attrition.

A.1.2 During Field Activities


Operations management: In addition to the list of villages enumerated during the Third Handloom Census, at the start of the project all the State handloom departments were also asked to share updated data on weaver locations. This gave an estimate of the number of villages/ workers that would be needed to be enumerated and this was the basis for field planning, including number of field manpower to be deployed for data collection and quality control.

The fieldwork for the Fourth Handloom census was formally launched on the third week of April 2017 in the States of Karnataka, Telangana, Odisha and Uttar Pradesh. It was gradually rolled out to all other States in phases. This ensured identification and treatment of any technical glitches within a manageable timeframe. While the central operations node was based out of Hyderabad, the coordination of the fieldwork followed a decentralised model for better control. Given below is the field management hierarchy that was established within KDMSL.

During the course of this survey, the survey agency had deployed:

 100 team members (research, operations, analytics, and support functions)

A.1.3 Post Field Activities

Accuracy check and feedback to field teams

Quality control (QC) for the entire project was centrally controlled from Hyderabad. The devised QC protocol included 100% checking of name spelling, age, address, and quality of pictures taken based on Aadhar/ Voter ID card. For this, a 246-member team was recruited and trained at the back end.

While this has been categorised as a post field

activity, in essence this was run simultaneous to the fieldwork activity in order to avoid backlog. Surveys with a very short interview time (time and duration of interview was tracked through the app) were flagged and such details were shared with the State teams. Cases with photo mismatch/ quality issues were sent back to the field for re-administration as the quality of Photo Identity Cards or Pehchan cards were dependent on picture quality taken during the census.

Local language translations of names of weavers and allied workers were checked judiciously as PICs were printed in the vernacular. This process also ensured the following:

· Geotag is verified

- Interview time and other check points validated
- Cropping of Weaver/Allied Photo to the specified sized for Photo ID card purpose

Further, various anomaly detection checks were run, by using algorithms, to read data trends. The following exhibit provides an overview of the 100% Quality Check Process for all respondents, weavers and allied workers.

Creation of MIS portal for Development Commissioner (Handlooms) to track progress and Online Validation portal

Given the pan-India scope of this exercise, it was imperative for multiple stakeholders, especially Development Commissioner (Handlooms) and various State Governments, to keep a track of

Figure A6: Quality Check Process





Figure A7: Samples from the Online Validation Portal

the progress of enumeration right down to the district level, which included knowing the count of households, weavers, allied workers and non-households. To facilitate this process, a real-time and online MIS structure was created. After quality control from our end, the information was shared with the district officials for their review. A step-by-step process manual using screenshots was shared with all the 537 district level officers in advance to aid in this process of validation.

A.1.4 Data Finalization

Re-visits as per feedback from districts

As per the quality control protocol, if missing lists were provided by the district officers, such households were only enumerated by the survey agency if they fulfilled the criteria for enumeration. Review by district level officers also helped in identifying if any villages/ urban clusters had been missed out.

Once the districts had completed the online validation, the entire survey data for each State was shared with respective State Handloom Departments to cross-check data points so that any correction could be carried out within the overall fieldwork period.

Sharing of data on public portal

Once any State had completed online validation, advertisement released in the State level that the weaver/allied worker data would be available for public verification for a period of one month. Any households with at least one weaver/allied worker could visit the portal on their own or visit

their nearest District Handloom Office and with the help of their name and/ or mobile number, could use the portal to verify whether they were included or excluded. If they could locate their name, they could further verify all the other data fields that were collected from them at the time of the survey, except information related to their caste, religion, photographs, Aadhar number and financial details, which were not released for public viewing. For those, who could not trace their names, the established protocol was that they could either inform the survey agency directly through the portal or approach the nearest district handloom/ Weaver Service Centers (WSCs) offices whose details were available on the website. Such people had to furnish the following for survey agency to approach them for enumeration:

- 1) Name
- 2) Address
- 3) Mobile number

For this round of re-enumeration, the following process was followed:

- The physical list of all household IDs and names of chief respondents, mobile numbers and addresses were carried by the enumerators when they visited a village which had raised inclusion requests
- 2) When the claimant was contacted and if their household could be located in the reenumerated list, only the claimant's details were added to that household ID. Since, surveyors had visited each village for a maximum of 2-4 days during any round of

enumeration, there was a distinct possibility that some household members were left out even though their family had been enumerated. Hence, such requests were realistic

3) However, if the claimant's household was never enumerated, then a new household ID was created and their entire family interview was taken provided they met the basic criteria for enumeration.

Despite such a multi-layered approach, the survey agency acknowledges that there could be still be instances of the census having left out weavers/ allied workers. However, it must be taken into consideration that these exclusions were despite the best efforts by everyone.


Printing and distribution of PICs

The design format of the PICs or Pehchan cards was approved by the Ministry. Two colour codes were used to distinguish between weavers' and allied workers' PICs. These were printed (in local language) by the survey agency and sent to district levels. Recruitment of delivery personnel for doorstep delivery was based on quantum of cards for all the villages covered under a district.

A.2 Data backup process

Another key backend feature was to ensure safety, backup and a robust data retrieval plan for this project. Given the large volume of data that was collected and processed (cloud storage space of over 4 TB), it was of utmost importance

that a robust disaster management protocol and data backup process was established. Daily database backup was maintained with sync to remote location. The survey agency also had a Standby Server in remote location for ensuring quick disaster recovery. The Production environment provided resilience for any failures of hardware and it was hosted in a tier four datacentres located within India. It included expandable cloud to manage scale, remote backups for manage disaster recovery and SAN Storage to make sure that the data storage was highly available. The data storage and retrieval was given maximum optimization as per the project requirement.

A.3 Challenges related to the census execution

This section summarises the challenges faced by the survey agency at various stages of execution, including access to conduct interviews, and the IT systems that had to be put in place for risk management.

Some key field challenges that were faced across the country:

 Difficult logistics and travel connectivity in almost all the Himalayan States. It took a few hours to reach the remote villages from the district headquarters. Even when

- survey was completed in a village cluster, sometimes enumerators had to wait for a day or two for a public transportation to arrive for them to travel back. Most of these States had very limited railway and regular public transportation available in the interior districts
- 2) Poor net connectivity was a problem faced not only in the mountainous States but also in the interior villages of States like Odisha, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, to name a few. While the application could run both in online and offline modes, in such areas there were days at a stretch when data could not be synced till the enumerators were not back at the district headquarters to achieve connectivity to upload the data
- 3) Local support in tribal districts was extremely important. Even local level enumerators had to gain the trust of village elders before beginning the enumeration process to ensure maximum co-operation
- 4) A lot of resistance was faced from large scale non-households. In many instances, Government officials had to intervene and ensure that field teams could gain entry into the premises. Most of the times enumerators were given loom and worker counts and not given a chance to walk around the premises to look into the operations.

About the Office of the Development Commissioner for Handlooms

The office of the Development Commissioner for Handlooms, in existence since 20th November, 1975 has been implementing various developmental and welfare schemes for the benefit of handloom weavers.

The Vision of the office of the Development Commissioner for Handlooms is:

- Support weavers to get earnings commensurate with market price of the products and their skills;
- · Link weavers directly with the market;
- · Provide inputs in terms of new design and product diversification;
- Facilitate weavers in production of high value, good quality products by providing skill upgradation, better technology, infrastructure, and easy availability of raw materials and working capital.

Office of the Development Commissioner for Handlooms is assisted by 28 Weavers' Service Centres (WSCs) located across the country. These WSC's play a pivotal role in skill up-gradation, capacity building and disseminating the technological interventions for reducing the drudgery and achieve better productivity, thereby improving earning of the weavers. They provide design input to the weavers, arrange training programs besides sponsoring weavers in various trade fairs and events.

To cater to the need of technical man power in handloom sector, six Indian Institute of Handloom Technology (IIHTs) are working under the administrative control of this office, which are conducting degree, post diploma and diploma courses in Handloom and Textile Technology.
